Despite severe need and higher health risks, people with intellectual disabilities (ID) lack equitable access to health services and die, on average, 20 years earlier than the general population in the United States.¹

This lack of access also limits their ability to obtain fitness, wellness, and prevention services. This reality results in pronounced health disparities including cardiovascular disease, cancer, and diabetes.

OUR SOLUTION

Special Olympics Health programming works towards equitable access to quality health promotion and services for people with ID.

Inclusive health means people with ID have access to high quality affordable health care services, and are empowered to take an active role in making their health and life choices. Special Olympics' PATH to Inclusive Health targets four areas of greatest need for people with ID.

revention: Ongoing programming in physical activity, fitness, early child development, and health education across the lifespan

ssessment: Health screenings and coordinated follow up care

raining: Training and curricula for the healthcare workforce to be more inclusive of people with ID

ealth Systems Strengthening: Innovative, targeted partnerships and policy changes to elevate the voices and health needs of people with ID

OUR SOLUTION

Promote inclusive mindsets

Reduce bullying and exclusion

Overturn negative stereotypes and attitudes

Eliminate hurtful languages in schools and elsewhere

Create higher levels of respect for diversity, social and civic learning, and school connectedness





Barriers for accessing quality health care include:

- Lack of formal training for health care providers
- Communication deficits between providers and patients

Findings from a Special Olympics study revealed that 55% of health care providers did not receive adequate training to include people with with ID in their programs and services

OUR OUTCOMES

Children who participated in just two months of Young Athletes (an inclusive early childhood development program) saw 7-9 months of motor skill improvement.



Athletes who participated in Special Olympics fitness programming experienced improved blood pressure, with the greatest improvement for those at high risk for cardiovascular disease.

THE CHALLENGE

Students with ID are less likely to spend time in a regular education environment than students with any other type of disability. There is a strong relationship between school connectedness and students' educational success, such as regular school attendance and staying in school. Special Olympics is responding to a clear need to promote and normalize a school environment that addresses academic needs of students with ID as well as their social need to make friends and feel welcome in the school community.



Students with ID are three times more likely to be bullied than their typically developing peers.



Over 60% of special education teachers have reported their students with intellectual and developmental disabilities rarely participate in school-based extracurricular activities.²

OUR OUTCOMES

97%

of Unified Champion Schools liaisons state that Unified Champion Schools reduces bullying, teasing, and use ofoffensive language in the school.

Unified Champion Schools programming is based on the evidence that students who "Play Unified" become more connected to their school community, better at sharing

responsibility, and better prepared as they leave school and enter society.
